

PHARMACY HAPPENINGS

Lilly is reducing costs of their insulin products

- Cutting the list price of its non-branded insulin, Insulin Lispro Injection 100 units/mL, to \$25 a vial. Effective May 1, 2023, it will be the lowest list-priced mealtime insulin available
- Cutting the list price of Humalog[®] (insulin lispro injection) 100 units/mL, Lilly's most commonly prescribed insulin, and Humulin[®] (insulin human) injection 100 units/mL2 by 70%, effective in Q4 2023.
- Launching RezvoglarTM (insulin glargine-aglr) injection, a basal insulin that is biosimilar to, and interchangeable with, Lantus® (insulin glargine) injection, for \$92 per five pack of KwikPens®, a 78% discount to Lantus, effective April 1, 2023.
- Effective immediately, Lilly will automatically cap out-of-pocket costs at \$35 at participating retail pharmacies for people with commercial insurance using Lilly insulin
